application procedures for first-time freshmen

If you are a U.S. resident, complete this application for admission and forward it to the Grace College Admissions Office. A \$30 application fee must accompany your application, payable to Grace College (waived for online application).

early action admission (non-binding)

Candidates who apply by December 1 will receive admission and preliminary scholarship notification within two weeks of application completion.

regular admission

Grace College has an application deadline of March 1.* Candidates who apply after December 1 will receive admission and preliminary scholarship decision within two weeks of application completion.

- Application materials due by March 1*
- Notification of decision Two weeks
- Enrollment deposit due May 1

* Applications received after March 1 are considered until the class is full.

school reference & transcripts request (enclosed)

All Grace College applicants must submit official high school transcripts. Complete the top portion of the school reference and transcript request form and forward it to your high school guidance counselor. The counselor will complete the remainder of the form and return it along with a copy of your official high school transcripts directly to the Grace College Admissions Office.

All applicants who have attended a post-secondary educational institution must submit transcripts from each post-secondary institution attended (even if no credit was earned or grades received). Complete the top portion of the college transcripts request form and send it to each post-secondary institution that you have attended since high school. Make copies of the form as necessary. The registrar at each of those institutions will complete the remainder of the form and return it along with a copy of your official transcripts from that institution directly to the Grace College Admissions Office.

ACT/SAT scores

All first-year freshmen applicants must submit an official copy of either ACT or SAT scores. An official copy of your scores may be obtained from your high school or by request from www.act.org or www.sat.org. The Grace College code numbers are 1198 for the ACT or 1252 for the SAT.

Transfer applicants must submit an official copy of either ACT or SAT scores if you have completed less than 15 hours of college coursework after graduating from high school. An official copy of your scores may be obtained from your high school or by request from www.act.org or www.sat.org. The Grace College code numbers are 1198 for the ACT or 1252 for the SAT.
